40. Batu Caves:

41. Kek Lok Si Temple:



Kek Lok Si Temple, constructed **in 1891**, is a prominent Malaysian tourist destination. This Buddhist-Chinese temple is "**The Temple of Supreme Bliss**." Buddha statues can be found in great numbers at Kek Lok Si Temple. This temple, among the biggest in Malaysia, attracts a steady stream of visitors from Southeast Asia. At this temple, one may see over **10,000 carvings** of the Buddha.

Destination: Malaysia, Air Itam, Penang.

Key Attractions: 10,000 Buddha carvings on the walls.

The entrance to the temple is on a hill, and there are **various booths** selling food, drinks, and souvenirs.

Advice: Bring some souvenirs related to Buddhism home for your friends and family.
